### Update Regarding Changes to Chemours Safety Data Sheets (SDS) and Labels

Effective May 2017, Chemours Safety Data Sheets (SDSs) and hazards labels (labels) will start to have a new look and will have changes to the SDS and label content. These changes are the result of the Chemours global standardization effort to continuously improve the quality and consistency of their hazard communications documents. Product compositions have not changed unless specifically communicated previously by your Sales representatives. The key changes include:

- **Format:** There are design changes such as formatting, font size, etc. that are different than what Chemours uses today; however, the regulatory structure of SDSs and labels continue to comply with local/regional/ national legislation.
- **SDS Title / Name:** To reflect the unique nature of our products, each product grade will now have its own individual SDS. The title of the SDS will therefore be the name of the specific product grade.
- **Classification:** When there are changes in component classifications, there may be an impact on product classifications in Section 2 of the SDS and may result in new or different pictograms, hazard-statements, precautionary statements or transportation Dangerous Goods classification in both SDSs and labels.

Changes in component classification may have resulted from amended regulations, new information received from vendors or new data becoming available from external as well as internal sources.

Please be assured that the new SDS is still compliant with local/regional/ national legislation and it appropriately communicates the hazards associated with the product you are purchasing from Fluorogistx.
